## The Call to Go Fishing

As we focus on celebrating the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ, I hope to shed light on what He has called us to do. Many claim that we need only to believe, confess, and repent of our sins to be reconciled into a right relationship with God. While this is correct, our walk with the Lord has just begun. We need to listen to His voice. He calls each of us to follow Him as He called the disciples. We need only to look at the words of Jesus at the beginning of His ministry and just before He ascended into heaven as the resurrected Lord. "While walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon (who is called Peter) and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Mat. 4:18-19). Both gospels of Matthew and Mark tell us that they "immediately left their nets and followed Him" (v.20). John's gospel tells us Jesus questioned two disciples following Him by asking, "What are you seeking?" (John 1:37). Although their reply was fleshly, Jesus told them to "Come and you will see" (John 1:39). Jesus came from heaven to earth to show us that He alone is "the Way, the Truth, and the Life" (John 14:6).

Many today are returning to their old habits and sinful lifestyles. Possibly, this is why Peter tells his friends that he was "going fishing" sometime after the resurrected Lord appeared and commissioned them (John 21:3). His influence caused them all to join him in fishing on the Sea of Tiberias. It was here, on the following morning, where they all encountered the Risen Lord Jesus. Probably, one of the most profound teaching moments is how Jesus restored Peter from denying Him three times (Mat.26:75), but as equally important is the details of Jesus' question, "do you love me more than these?" (John 21:15). Each of the commands from Jesus to Peter applies to all who are called to follow Jesus, as He is the one who makes us become fishers of men by submitting as a devoted, lifelong follower to Him as Lord. May we all commit to follow Jesus so closely that we begin to act like Him as His disciples did after they received the indwelling Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8).

Pray about joining us on future mission trips to be used as fishers of men.

  - Although we were able to continue the work on Ruth's home (see Page 1), we are still in need of approximately \$500 to complete the home.

- O MLI CHRISTIAN STUDY CENTERS: As our #1 objective in East Africa, we are obeying our Lord's command in making disciples that make disciples. THANKS to a donor for helping us with books and meals for our students during their weeks of study. PRAISE THE LORD.
- O WIDOWS SUPPORT FUND: MLI is constantly caring for a growing number of widows in Uganda. We would like ask for you to consider joining our James 1:27 projects in caring for widows in their time of need. Your generosity is appreciated and needed. Pastor Timothy Sentongo, Basana Baptist, has been back in the hospital for surgery, removing more tumors, and is asking for help with his medical bills. - MISSION TRIP ASSISTANCE: Our next trip to Kenya scheduled in June will be more costly than Uganda. Will you consider helping with our costs to perform much needed medical clinics in a region that has suffered from famine and drought over the last year? (See above)
- **DEAF SCHOOL FUND:** Ongoing administrative expenses to pay teachers, feed deaf students, and many other needs of managing a school in Uganda. To witness the students (deaf and others with disabilities) learning actual skills to help them in life is Amazing. There is a NEED to purchase sewing machines (2) to assist them in making sweaters and other stitches items to sell. **\$250** would help us secure two machines
