

Lights in the Darkness

hile many people are aware of the darkness in the spiritual sense, today there remains a great number that are simply unaware of the dangers from living apart from the Light of Christ. Darkness itself is generally understood as the absence of light. Not having any substance, force or even energy, but is considered as the complete absence of those elements or items. However, we know that Light will always prevail as it causes all darkness to flee from the moment light appears.

To a world lost in moral and spiritual gloom, the Bible presents a profound vision of believers as "lights in the darkness". The Scriptures reveal Jesus as the ultimate source of all light, who then commissions his followers to reflect his radiance to a "crooked and twisted generation". This calling, rooted in his divine nature and empowered by his indwelling Spirit, is not merely an option but a central aspect of Christian identity and witness.



The source of light: The Lord Jesus Christ

The biblical concept of light begins in Genesis, where God creates light to overcome the original darkness (Genesis 1:3). In the creation account, our universal sources of light were not created until the fourth day (Gen. 1:16). In the Gospel of John, this divine power is personified in Jesus Christ, the eternal "Word" of God.

John 1:3–5: "All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it". This passage asserts that Jesus is the creative force behind all existence and the origin of both life and spiritual light. The darkness of sin, ignorance, and death cannot overcome his illuminating power.

John 8:12: Later in his ministry, Jesus declares, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." This statement is a claim to divinity and an invitation to humanity. Following Jesus reorients one's life from spiritual blindness to guidance by Christ. This "light of life" is an inner transformation that provides moral clarity and purpose.

The reflection of light: A transformed life

With Jesus as the primary source, believers are called to be secondary lights—reflecting his glory in a world still shrouded in darkness. Matthew 5:14-16: "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." Jesus informs us that others will see as we reflect His glorious light by how we love and serve others.

Philippians 2:14–16: "Do all things without grumbling or questioning, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast to the word of life". This passage is the blueprint for how believers are to be lights. Witness is not just in words, but in daily conduct.

The source of this illumination is "the word of life". By holding fast to the truth of the gospel, believers are equipped to navigate a morally corrupt world and show others the way to Christ.

This biblical perspective has significant implications for Christian living.

A contrast to the world: The Christian life is defined by a separation from the "unfruitful deeds of darkness". How believers treat each other, handle adversity, and express hope contrasts with the surrounding culture. Actions either brighten the darkness or blend in with the shadows.

An eternal hope: The call to shine as lights is tied to the promise of Jesus' return. In Philippians 2:16, Paul links the faithful witness of the Philippians to the "day of Christ," when his work will be vindicated. This hope reminds believers that their efforts are not in vain, for the light they reflect points to a final victory over darkness.

In conclusion, the biblical perspective of being a light in the darkness is a divine commission rooted in Jesus, the Light of the World. This identity is expressed through moral purity, joy, and peace, which contrasts with the world's ways. By holding fast to the gospel, believers become beacons, offering hope and guiding others toward the ultimate source of light and life. My prayer is that we will all shine the Light of Christ so others will see Him and not us, as He alone can give eternal salvation.

MLU CHRISTIAN STUDY CENTERS: Our #1 objective is to make disciples that make disciples. Donations help us to continue this work.
