One Body (One Church), Many Members

oday there are many different opinions of what makes up the church of God. No, I am not referring to any one of the denominations. Rather, I am speaking of what makes up the entirety of God's family here on earth. While some hold to certain dogmatic beliefs, believing that only a select minority or group will inherit the kingdom of God, I have found that our Creator God has totally and completely opened His great invitation up to ALL who will come to Him for salvation. However, there is a requirement to acknowledge and submit to the Lordship of His Only Son, Jesus Christ. "Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12-NKJV) As record in the Gospel of John, Jesus even made this claim. Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." (John 14:6)

Now that we've covered that basis for becoming part of the family of God, I would like to turn our attention to an issue with the Body, known as the Church. The Apostle Paul targeted this issue in several of his letters to the churches. He taught about the specific gifts that make up the body of Christ and how all are equally important. "For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another." (Rom. 12:4-5) However, to the church in Corinth, Paul addresses how the body of Christ is similar to that of the human body. "For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit. For in fact the body is not one member but many." (1 Cor. 12:12-14) The next several verses go on to explain how each member cannot exist separated from the others. In fact, all members need each other to be a healthy and productive body, working together to accomplish much for the kingdom of our Lord and God.

Furthermore, the verse towards the end of that church anatomy lesson gets overlooked or passed over without considering how it negatively affects the church and causes us to lose respect from unbelievers in the world today. Are you ready for it? Here it is:

→ "And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; or if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it." (1 Corinthians 12:26)

Not that the church lives or operates to gain the respect of the lost but I, personally, cannot count how many times I have heard unbelievers point out all the missed opportunities for the church (US) to show genuine compassion that reflects the love, grace, and mercy, of our Heavenly Father. There are many forgotten members of the body of Christ that are suffering greatly. Meanwhile, there are churches in the USA that have adopted (knowingly or unknowingly) beliefs that we must help those within their local communities or only in the USA. While local missions is a "must", we should not overlook that we have Christian brothers and sisters globally that can be helped tremendously with a fraction of what is wasted here in the USA. I read the other day how California is missing receipts for approximately \$20 Billion of the \$24 Billion they spent to help with the states homelessness problem. I know the Lord owns the cattle on a thousand hills, or even a billion hills, still I wonder what great work in advancing the gospel could be done with just a fraction of all the funds wasted through corruption.

In light of this, I am blessed the Lord saw fit to call me to Mission Link International. There is much to do with educating pastors and church leaders to give them a firm biblical foundation. We have widows that need support and several that are homeless, yet we are being led to move into a third village that has over 100 widows in need. The Lord often reminds me that He is the One that is working and through our obedience allows us to be a part of His kingdom growth by loving the suffering, while pointing them to the Lord Jesus.
