Dirty Feet

Sins can weigh a Christian down

uring the final hours before the crucifixion, Jesus took a towel and basin and washed the feet of the disciples. When Christ positioned himself to wash Peter's feet, the disciple bemoaned: "Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head!" Jesus said to him, 'He who is bathed needs only to wash his feet, but is completely clean..." (John 13:9,10). The blood of Christ cleanses us from ALL sin. Hence, we are completely clean, free from the penalty of sin—spiritual death. Yet, there are times when a believer sins, resulting in "dirty feet." Does this mean that a person can lose their salvation? Absolutely NOT! However, there are some things that can be lost, like peace, joy, an effective witness, intimacy with God, etc. Sins can even have detrimental consequences, resulting in the tarnishing and loss of one's

testimony! A prime example is King David's sin with Bathsheba and the orchestration of her husband's death. Please read Psalm 51, highlighting the effects of unconfessed sin even though David was a man after God's heart.

Sin in a believer's life slows/weighs down the Christian. The writer of Hebrews penned: "Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance (hindrance) and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the Author and Perfecter of faith..." (12:1-2a). Sins can entangle and weigh down God's people, grieving the Holy Spirit.

Back in the 70s, I drove a small VW pickup truck through a deep mud hole on an old country road. I made it through the slurpee mess without consequences—so I thought! When driving on the highway, the truck began to shake uncontrollably. The mechanic discovered the issue. Caked in the wheel hubs was mud that disturbed the wheel-balance. Sin is the mud/dirt that disrupts our spiritual walk/balance. It makes us dirty, hindering our usability and spiritual progress. In the "Sermon on the Mount," Jesus warns his disciples that their salt (an effective witness) can lose its savor to the point that they are "good for nothing anymore, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men" (Matt. 5:13b).

Throughout our Christian life, we must continually repent of sins/dirt, which will weigh down/slow our spiritual momentum, even though our, salvation is secure. Does this give a believer a license to sin? No! (Read Romans 6:1ff) However, if our ambition is to glorify and please God, believers will shun sin. Peter was saved by grace and not by his ability to keep the law. However, the Bible reveals that there were times Peter was soiled by sin (dirty feet). Paul gives believers sobering advice regarding sin: "...I discipline my body and make it my slave, so that, after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified" (1 Cor. 9:27). Paul constantly warns Christians throughout his epistles about the dangers of sin. The writer of Hebrews puts it plain and straight: "You have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood in your striving against sin (12:4)." Therefore, pastors must continually remind believers of the dangers and consequences of allowing sin into one's life.

Daily, we must "fix our eyes on Jesus" and pray: "Lead me not into temptation but deliver me from the evil one." Yet, there are times we need our "feet washed," repenting of sins we commit—those sins that overtake Christians from time to time—that hinder a person from running an excellent race. May those who read the above words sincerely desire to live a life that brings glory & honor to God.

As one school comes to a close our teaching staff is out mobilizing for establishing the next location to train students in the Word of God. Donations to MLI helps us to continue this call of making disciples.
- O **WIDOWS SUPPORT FUND**: MLI is constantly caring for a growing number of widows in Uganda.
