

What determines our identity?

oday, the answer of identity comes from many circumstances mixed with some fact that molds people's opinions. While much of the information gathered from those questions can be helpful, one key piece is still missing from the equation that brings a solid conclusion. That key happens to be the most critical factor and is none other than the "Word of God."

Historically, any nation that began trusting in the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (Israel) flourished and prospered. As the Psalmist wrote: "Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD" (Psa. 33:12). However, they became an example to the nations once they strayed from following His statutes and commandments. Much of the Old Testament is about Israel learning this over and over as they continued to forsake the LORD and then finding themselves enslaved to an ungodly people causing them to cry out to the LORD. Psalm 107 shines a light on this while revealing how faithful the LORD is to His people. Four times in this Psalm, it states: "Then they cried out to the LORD in their trouble, And He saved them out of their distresses" (vs. 6, 13, 19, 28). When the chosen people of GOD turn from being obedient to their loving Father in heaven, they essentially forget who they are and attempt to behave like someone they are not. Likewise, this is exactly what has been happening since the Garden of Eden when people live sinful lifestyles, not wanting to be held accountable, and begin to believe the lies from darkness about their identity.

Yes, God did choose the Hebrew people to walk with them, provide for them, and bless them. That was all contingent upon their obedience to His commandments. "Therefore you shall keep the commandments of the LORD your God, to walk in His ways and to fear Him" (Deut. 8:6). However, there was also a grave warning issued along with those sweet promises. "Then it shall be, if you by any means forget the LORD your God, and follow other gods, and serve them and worship them, I testify against you this day that you shall surely perish" (Deut. 8:19). The LORD is still upholding His part of the covenant He made for all who will live by faith in Jesus, the Son of GOD, who came from heaven to earth to demonstrate His great love for all who will call Him LORD (Rom. 5:8; Gal. 2:20). No longer should we to be identified by the family we were born, the color of our skin, the language we speak, but by who we confess is our Lord and live to please (Rom. 10:11-13). Because of this, we all have the opportunity to become part of the family of God and play an intricate part of His kingdom work here on earth.

There is freedom from being confused about who we are or striving to find our place in this world. While it appears many have it all together, the fact is that many struggle with feeling insignificant and that their life does not matter. Not totally yielding to God brings the shadow of shame from being identified by our sins. God not only says that is incorrect, but He performed the greatest act of love through the death, burial, and resurrection of His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, to open the doors so that you and I could become His children. The Gospel of John 1:10-13 says, "He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him. He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him. But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God." Those that are born-again are no longer identified by the sins of their past as the Lord has washed, sanctified, and justified them in the name of the Lord Jesus and by the Spirit of our God (1 Cor. 6:11).

My prayer is that every person reading this article knows that they are indeed a child of God, adopted into His family, and having the assurance of salvation that comes only through Jesus Christ (John 14:6; 1 John 5:13). And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us an understanding, that we may know Him who is true; and we are in Him who is true, in His Son Jesus Christ. This is the true God and eternal life (1 John 5:20).

God's word has the final say about who we are "in Him." Do not listen to the voices of this world that aim to sow seeds of confusion and destruction. Instead, trust and rely solely on who God says you are as you draw closer to Jesus.
