nyone that has been radically changed by the powerful gospel of Christ Jesus will agree and testify how it has supernaturally improved their lives from bad to good. However, if we look and investigate the details, we will find that for most their circumstances did not change. So then how were their lives changed for the better? While many of life's problems are universal and come and go, yet our outlook and perspective totally change once we are filled with the Spirit of Truth (John 14:17). It can be said that if our focus is on the Lord JESUS, we gain a spiritual vision that is better than 20/20. The Cross changes everything because we begin to see the world through eyes of gratitude and thankfulness once we learn how much the LORD loves us and what He has done to secure our eternity with Him.

The picture above is seven hundred 2.2 kilogram bags of sugar that were then combined with seven hundred bags of rice, and then also maize flour, that our Kenya mission team filled on our first day in Nairobi. These gift bags were going to be distributed to many families in areas surrounding Nairobi that have been impacted by recent severe flooding. Many homes and multi-level buildings were washed away. In addition, the Kenya government began restricting access to those flooded areas and tearing down the remaining buildings that were built within the dangerous flood zones. This action has caused the homeless numbers to multiply, and many thousands of people are in desperate need of food. However, as people with faith in God, we know that He supplies all our needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus (Phil. 4:19). While these 700 bags will only be a temporary supply to help some 700 families, we trust in the God who can turn bitter situations into sweet blessings. Much like the Lord did for Moses and the children of Israel. Shortly after Moses led Israel out of Egypt, crossing the Red Sea (Exodus 14), they entered the wilderness of Shur for three days without water. Their situation became more desperate once they found water in a place called Marah but the water was undrinkable from being bitter. The Word of God tells us, "And the people complained against Moses, saying, "What shall we drink?" So he cried out to the LORD, and the LORD showed him a tree. When he cast it into the waters, the waters were made sweet. (Exod. 15:24-25a) What Moses did next reveals what great leaders do in moments where people need to learn valuable lessons. "There He made a statute and an ordinance for them, and there He tested them, and said, "If you diligently heed the voice of the LORD your God and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have brought on the Egyptians. For I am the LORD who heals you." (Exod. 15:25b-26)

The important lesson here was not that the people of Israel should have been happy with bitter water, but rather than complaining against Moses, they should have trusted in the Lord God who saved them from the Egyptians and promises to keep them safe if they obey His voice. Even though we are saved by grace, the same principle applies to the church today. God has not changed (Malachi 3:6). All our mission efforts, in Kenya or Uganda, are an act of obedience to God's commandments. First, to present the gospel of salvation through Jesus Christ alone. Second, to make disciples through teaching believers to follow Jesus in every area of life, loving others unconditionally.

Oh, if we would learn to trust in the sovereignty of the LORD and seek His face in all of life's circumstances because His ways are higher than ours. If we find ourselves becoming bitter, in any way, let us turn to the LORD and spend time in the sweet Word of GOD.
